# War Workers Stabilized In Jobs Drs. Henry and Plan Expected to Halt Turnover, Migration Hayes Launch

Practically all workers in the major industrial plants here are "stabilized" in their jobs and have been since the Southern California Arca War Manpower Commission made a far-reaching plan effective Monday morning, Workers in designated essential industries may now switch jobs only if they have a "certificate of availability from the War Manpower Commission.

Three basic points are involved in the stabilization program, according to H. R. Harnish, Southern California director of the W. M. C. and chairman of the area committee. They are:

1—An employer shall hire a worker only upon presentation of a W. M. C. "availability certificate" which has been furnished by the job applicant's last employer or by an authorized agent of the W. M. C.

2—Availability certificates shall be issued to workers seeking new jobs only when a change of employers that in the best interests of the war effort.

3—Employers shall not discharge or lay off any employe except when such action is necessitated by circumstances and conditions beyond the control of employers or when such action is net the best interests of the war effort.

The classifications are: Alycraft and aircraft parts, shipyards and ship equipment, ordnance, ammunition, food processing, lumbering, metal mining, nonmetalle mining, smelting and refining produc-tion of metal shapes and forgings;
