Nazi Bombs Failed to Halt Film Activity

"Flying Fortress" the English-produced Warner Bros. picture, opening Sunday at the Plaza theater in Hawthorne, presented almost insurmountable difficulties in its making. It was not made in Hollywood where make-believe is the order of the day, but in England, under the grilling bomb-fire to which that unconquerable country has been subjected.

The British military authorities were so deeply impressed with the value to the general public of witnessing the deadly action of the Flying Fortress—without revealing information which might be of aid to the enemy—that both the Royal Air Force and the Atlantic Ferry Command co-operated in making the spectacular picture. The British Army also granted leave from the tank corps to Richard Greene, that he might play the role of the American playboy who becomes a member of Atlantic Ferry Command and later a Royal Canadian Air Force pilot.

Important rationing dates are listed below:

- Coffee
Coupon No. 28 is good for one pound of coffee until Feb. 8.
- Sugar
Jan. 31—Coupon No. 10 is good for three pounds of sugar thru this date.
- Gasoline and Tires
No. 4 coupons became valid Jan. 22.
- Jan. 31—Last day that temporary "T" coupons will be issued directly by rationing boards. Beginning Feb. 1, "T" rations will be issued on the basis of ODT Certificates of War Necessity.
- Feb. 23—Holders of "B" and "C" stickers must have tires inspected by this date.
- March 31—Holders of "A" stickers must have tires inspected by this date.

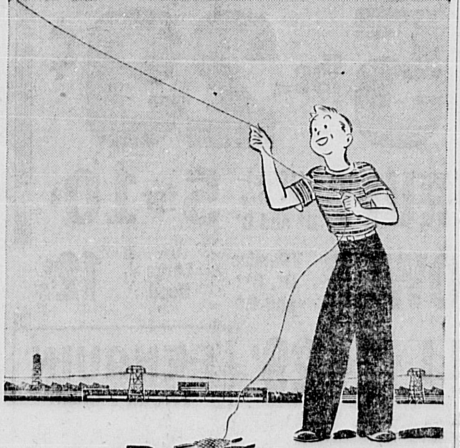

Play safe KITE FLYERS

This year, more than ever before, it is important that you do not fly your kites near electric power lines...not only for your own safety, but also to avoid possible damage to power lines supplying electricity to vital war factories. Here are the complete safety rules for flying kites:

1. Fly your kite in an open field, away from power lines.
2. Never use wire, tinsel or metallic string.
3. Be sure the cord is perfectly dry.
4. If your kite catches in a power line, let go. Don't pull! Phone the company owning the line and a lineman will come to get your kite for you.
