Under the new plan, this age group may apply for volunteer enlistment and if found qualified will be given an opportunity to enter their chosen branch of the service. Ratings up to chief petty officer can be given, in contrast to the previous induction as apprentice seamen only. The change does not affect the eligible volunteer age bracket of 17-year-olds and 38 to 50 inclusive who can enlist as heretofore.


