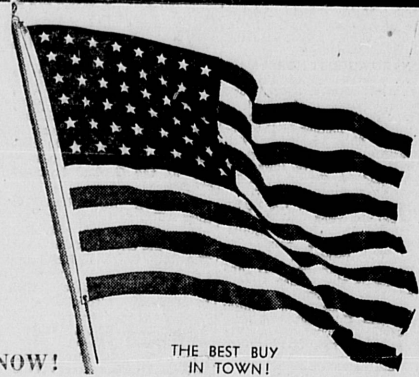

Los Angeles Again Postpones Annexing War Plant Locations

Annexation of the Dominguez tract north of Torrance on which new synthetic rubber plants are located, set as a special order of business by the Los Angeles city council last Friday, again was postponed, this time until April 9, as the result of a telegram from President Sam H. Husbands of the Defense Plant Corp., Washington, D. C., which read as follows:

"Hector Haight, our agency manager, has been requested by wire to request the city council to take no action with respect to the annexation of our synthetic rubber project properties pending final determination of certain matters involved and receipt by us of information necessary to reach our conclusion.

"If the council is unable to comply with such request it is necessary under the circumstances that the Defense Plant Corp. hereby withdraw its authorization respecting the annexation proceedings and register objections thereto.

Last Thursday the Los Angeles council voted the annexation and then rescinded its action at the request of City Attorney Ray L. Chesebro, who explained his assistant now in Washington, had urged delay.

Previously protests against the annexation were made by representatives of the Dow Chemical Co. and the Shell Chemical Co., lessees who will operate the rubber plant, until the council adopted an ordinance exempting them from certain provisions of the Los Angeles building code.

When objection continued, notwithstanding that the Water and Power Department is connecting up with the plant, even while it is outside the city limits, the contention was made in the Los Angeles council that the operators were seeking to get use of city utilities without coming under city regulation and taxation by annexation.
