Four-Fold Increase in Government Costs Disclosed by Official

State Controller Harry B. Riley announced in Sacramento this week that the combined cost of city and county government in California has increased nearly four-fold in the past 25 years.

Riley said that expenditures of the state's 284 cities, including San Francisco, and 57 counties, last year exceeded those of the World War I year of 1917 by 387 per cent. The figures were revealed with the release of the controller's annual report on financial transactions of cities and counties.
