nounced that violators may be punished, after a hearing, by invoking any one of the following penalties:  
**Penalties Provided**  
Issuance of availability certificates to the offending firm's employees permitting them to transfer to other essential jobs; refusal to refer new workers to the employer; denial by the U. S. E. S. of its employment facilities; requests to selective service that it refuse temporary draft deferments to the company's employees for replacement training purposes, and withdrawal of all other services by the War Manpower Commission.

San Diego has been placed in Class I, or critical labor shortage area, where war contracts are not being placed or renewed and a compulsory 48-hour week is in effect.

- RED STAMPS**—(for meat, canned fish, canned milk, most edible oils and cheeses). Stamp P, now valid, good through July 31; Red Stamp Q valid July 4.
- BLUE STAMPS**—(for canned, frozen and certain dehydrated foods). Stamps K, L, M, remain valid through July 7; N, P, Q now good through Aug. 7.
- COFFEE**—Stamp 21 good for one pound through July 21.
- SUGAR**—Stamp 13 good for 5 pounds through Aug. 15. Stamps 15 and 16 good for 5 pounds each for home canning purposes.
- SHOES**—Stamp 18 good for one pair through Oct. 31.
- GASOLINE**—No. 6 coupons in "A" books good for 4 gallons through July 21. Save "A" book covers as they must be turned in with applications for new "A" book before July 21. Application blanks for new "A" books now available at service stations.
- TIRE INSPECTION**—"B" book cars, next tire inspection deadline, June 30 and every 4 months thereafter; "C" book cars, next tire inspection deadline Aug. 31. "A" book cars, next tire inspection deadline Sept. 30.
- WAR RATION BOOK**—Thousands of Book 3 have already been mailed back to Southern California applicants. Your name is already on the book but you MUST fill in your address, age, sex, weight, height, complexion, then sign your name in the space provided on the cover.

# Applicants for 'A' Renewals Urged to Avoid 11th Hour Rush

Motorists with the basic "A" gasoline rationing status this week were urged by Frank H. Daniels, chief clerk of the Torrance War Price and Rationing Board, to apply for renewal as soon as possible to avoid overtaxing of the rationing board personnel.  
Renewal applications are available at the Rationing Board, 2300 Carson st., and at all service stations.  
The application may be mailed to the board and must be accompanied by the tire inspection record, showing at least one bonafide inspection. The back cover of the expiring "A" book, bearing the applicant's name and correct address, also must be forwarded with the application. The new "A" book will be mailed to applicants and becomes valid July 22. Motorists applying for renewal are urged to complete requirements at once and thus assure prompt delivery of the new coupon booklet by the opening day of the new rationing period. "A" motorists are warned that the present No. 6 coupon must last until July 21 deadline.
