Parents Warned Not to Neglect Child Earaches

The present wartime shortage of doctors calls for the attention of medical attention, states Dr. H. O. Swartz, chairman of the health committee of the Los Angeles county citizens service corps, but there are some ailments needing such attention which even in normal times are too often neglected, and now much more so. One such ailment is earache in children.

An earache most often comes from an infection in the middle ear, that part of the ear on the inner side of the drum. If this infection comes along with a scarlet fever, measles, whooping cough, or some other infectious illness, as often happens, the child will probably already be under medical care, and the physician will be watching for signs of ear infection so he can take care of it in time. But the infection may come with an ordinary cold, sore throat or some other simple ailment, and the signs of earache or a complaint of it may not seriously alarm the child's parents.

Pain from infection in the middle ear may break through the ear drum and run out. If it does, the drum itself may be the only part of the body that is damaged. If it does not break through the drum it may spread through the spongy bone behind the ear and cause not only a long and painful siege of mastoiditis, but it may spread even further to the brain or its coverings and take the child's life. Opening the drum with a lance and letting the pus drain out has a good chance of preventing all of these distressing and dangerous complications, if done in time.

It is true that a cold wind blowing against the ear, or an obstruction of the tube leading from the throat to the middle ear, may cause earache, so that all cases of pain in the ear are not necessarily serious. Dropping a few drops of warmed olive oil or of 5 per cent phenol in glycerine into a painful ear, or applying a hot water bottle covered with a dry towel to the side of the head over the ear, may relieve the pain; but if relief does not come within a very few hours, or if it is not complete relief, see that expert medical aid is secured without further delay.
