Eviction Law for Roomers Liberalized

Los Angeles and Orange county householders renting rooms in their own homes to other families were today cautioned by David Barry, Jr., that liberalization of regulations covering such rentals does not mean complete elimination of eviction restrictions.

Effective Aug. 1 such householders who rent one or more

furnished rooms not constituting separate apartments to other families will not be bound by O.P.A.'s eviction restrictions, but can evict according to local law.

This amendment, however, Barry said, applies only to this one class of rental, and does not include rentals of apartments or where rooms are let to more than one outside family in the same house. In such cases, O.P.A.'s restrictions against arbitrary eviction continue in effect.

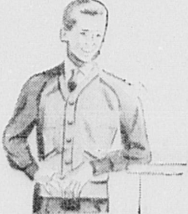
