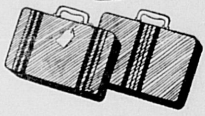

**Local Men Bag  
Deer on Hunt  
In Mono County**

The boys all told him he would get "buck fever." He was warned against a number of old-time "bogeys" that generally intimidate the embryo deer hunter, but on Tuesday morning Carl Stiles who operates the Dinkey Fish Market in Lomita, and is well known to most everyone in the community, came home with the biggest deer brought down by the group with which he hunted in Mono county last week.

Stiles, Eddie Branscomb of 1324 Acacia ave., Torrance, Andy Cochran of 808 Amapola ave., Torrance, and H. R. Kelly of Chino, made up the party that loaded up with deer tags, ammunition and groceries and headed for the high country last Sunday night. Arriving about 14 miles from their objective, a canyon and camp near Crestview, on Glass creek, the party met an Indian shepherd, who turned out to be packer, guide, and real friend. The Indian loaded the boys' stuff on his four mules and landed them right where they figured to locate their bucks.

All got a deer except Cochran, who had a number of good shots, but luck was against him. Stiles got his five-pointer about noon on Saturday within 200 yards of camp. The hunters camped for three days near the camp where the Indian guide and his partner had been running a flock of sheep.

Branscomb and Cochran are in the welding department at the Bethlehem Steel Corp. plant in supervisory positions, while Kelly is a welding equipment contractor.

Stiles insists that he had the time of his life, was glad he was able to take all the "kidding" and that in the long run was able to get the biggest deer in the party, and that he got it almost in the back yard of the camp.
