Since all jobs in stores, offices and other business and industrial concerns are covered by the Social Security Act, it is necessary for the worker to present his social security account card before taking the job.

HIGH SCHOOL CADETS
The California high school cadet corps, which now numbers some 14,000 cadets, will reach a strength of 25,000 by the end of 1943, Brig. Gen. Ray W. Hays, state adjutant general, predicted today. Hays announced that nearly 90 teachers have recently completed refresher courses at the University of California in Berkeley and Los Angeles, and that they are being commissioned in the State Guard as cadet instructors.


