Gas Bills Issued Every Other Mo. In This District

Gas users in Gardena, Lomita Torrance and other cities, and in unincorporated areas through

Torrance and other cities, and in unincorporated areas throughout the county will receive their gas bills only once every other month under a new system now being introduced by Southern California Gas Company.

According to notice now being mailed to customers, the change from a monthly to a bimonthly billing basis is being made in order to save manpower, tires and supplies as part of the general warstime Conservation program. Any customer who wishes to continue his budget on a monthly basis may secure coupons from the gas company upon which an estimate of the usual monthly bill will be shown. These coupons can be mailed in with an advance payment on the off-billing months, an adjustment of over- or under-payments being made with the regular bill every two months.

About 62,000 meters are involved in the change, according to G. W. Carbee, company division manager. The gas company experimented with the plan in some sections of Los Angeles county before introducing it here, he declared. Results there have been quite satisfactory, not only from the point of view of the company but from that of the customer as well.

ORDINANCE NO. 318

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE CREATING A FUND FOR CAPITAL OUTLAYS.

The City Council of the City of Torrance does ordain as follows:

of Torrance does ordain as follows:
SECTION 1. A fund is hereby created for capital outlays for public improvements under the provisions of that certain Act of the Legislature of the State of California entitled: "An Act to provide for the levy and collection of taxes and assessments for the purpose of creating a fund for capital outlays by Cities, Countles, Cities and Countles, or Districts," approved July 1, 1937, and being Chapter 717 of the Statutes of 1937, as amended.

SECTION 2. Such fund shall

SECTION 2. Such fund shall be known as "Special Fund for Capital Outlays," and said fund shall remain inviolate for the making of such capital outlays as the City Council shall direct to be made from such fund, and no monies shall be disbursed therefrom for any other purpose, excepting upon consent of the electors obtained as provided in said Act, as amended.
SECTION 3. Taxes may be levied upon the taxable property in said City for the raising of menics for said fund but no levies so made shall exceed the limitations imposed by the General Laws of the State upon the

which such proposition may be submitted.

SECTION 4. The City Coun cil may transfer to such fund any unincumbered surplus funds remaining on hand in this City at the end of any fiscal year.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall take effect thirty days after the date of its adoption and prior to the expiration of fifteen days from the passage thereof shall be published at least once in the Torrance Herald, a week by newspaper published and circulated in the City of Torrance and thereupen and thereafter the same shall be in full force and effect.
