Keep Speed at 35-Mi. Pace, Garland Urges

The State Motor Vehicle department today advocated continued observance of the 35-mile speed limit as the best method of keeping California cars rolling for another year.
Director Gordon Garland warned against excessive speeds and reported that department investigations, based on findings of the Federal Public Roads Administration, indicate tires wear out four times as fast at 65 miles per hour as at 35.
Studies of the federal agency, he said, show that tires will wear an average of 18,700 miles at 65 miles per hour and will wear 56,500 miles if driven over the same roads at 35.
