WAR RATION BOOK NO. 1

SHOES—Stamp 18 good for one pair. Expiration date indefinite.

WAR RATION BOOK NO. 2

BLUE STAMPS—(for canned, frozen and certain dehydrated foods), in War Ration Book 2, Stamps X, Y and Z through Nov. 20.

WAR RATION BOOK 3

BROWN stamps—for meat, canned fish, most edible oils, cheeses and canned milk; G, H and I good through Dec. 4. K good Nov. 14.

WAR RATION BOOK NO. 4

Stamp No. 29 (5 lbs. sugar)—Good now and through Jan. 15, 1944.

GREEN stamps—for canned, frozen and certain dehydrated foods; A, B and C good now through Dec. 20.

GASOLINE

COUPON No. 8 (A-Book) good through Nov. 21 for three gallons of gasoline. All new style coupons, A, B and C, must be endorsed on face with car license number and state of registration.

THE INSPECTION—"D" book cars, next tire inspection deadline, Oct. 31 and every 4 months thereafter; "C" book cars, next tire inspection deadline Nov. 30 and every 3 months thereafter; "A" book cars, next tire inspection deadline March 31, 1944 and every 6 months thereafter.

RATION BOARD OFFICE HOURS—At 2300 Carson st., daily from 9:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Women Urged to Accept Work In War Industries

In a message to women, whose responsibilities permit, Mrs. John Stearns Thayer, junior past-president of the State Federation of Women's clubs, today advocated that they give immediate consideration to work in war plants.

Mrs. Thayer, who is a member of the county and city sponsored Citizens' Manpower committee, urged that women enter war work now, without waiting to be called upon by volunteer canvassers, who will soon take part in a county-wide house-to-house recruitment drive.

"The time has come," she asserted, "when there can be no further delay on the part of American women in backing our fighting forces through production of war machinery and materials on the home front."

While the house-to-house canvass will include every home and living unit, she said, it will stand as a credit to womanhood if a large majority of the women interviewed can tell the canvasser they already are engaged in war work.

"Women have another responsibility that should be emphasized at this time for the survival of democracy," the club leader said. "This responsibility is the proper rearing of their young."

"One of the most excellent ideas, developed by the manpower committee, is a plan to establish sub-assembly shops in the various neighborhoods."

"These shops will be within walking distance of many homes, or so conveniently located that transportation problems with their incident delays will be reduced to a minimum."

Every mother, declared Mrs. Thayer, must assure herself that her children, whether of teen age or younger, are properly occupied and cared for, or else she should stay out of war work.

Unless this precaution is taken, she pointed out, juvenile delinquency may be expected to increase rather than diminish as the war goes on.

Supervisors Urge Citizens to Work In War Industries


The Board of Supervisors at its meeting Tuesday called upon all citizens of Los Angeles county who can be spared in civilian activities to arrange his affairs with the view of entering war production either on a part or full-time basis.

A resolution, adopted on advice from the County War Manpower Commission, asserted that a critical labor shortage exists in essential war industries which threatens enforcement of drastic federal controls over labor and management and immediate cancellation of war contracts and stoppage of production for civilian uses.
