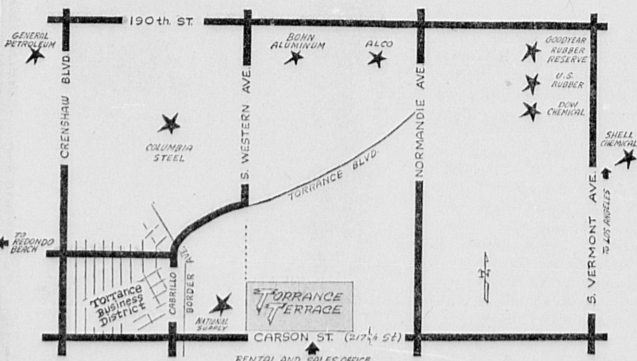

Seasonal Employment in Canning Factories Shows Sharp Decline

Seasonal reductions in the fruit and vegetable canning industries, coupled with the re-opening of schools caused a sharp drop in California manufacturing employment during September, according to Paul Scharrenberg, state director of industrial relations. The director reported that the total number of factory workers decreased some 41,000 in September from the record level reached in the previous month. In spite of the seasonal decrease, however, the September figure was far above that of the same month of 1942. Scharrenberg pointed out that the number of women wage earners in California manufacturing plants continued at record-breaking levels in September with more than 253,000 women employed.

Forest Fire Damage Mounts in California

The state forestry division today reported 1943 fires in forests and ranges patrolled by state crews were more destructive than those in either 1942 or 1941. Damage from the blazes for the first 10 months of this year was set at \$4,354,347, compared to \$4,307,325 in 1942 and \$3,966,714 in 1941. A total of 7843 fires were reported in the 1943 period, compared to 6884 in 1942. They included 5789 forest fires and 2054 blazes which damaged buildings. The 1943 fires burned over a total of 412,824 acres, including 9477 acres of timber, 210,504 acres of brush, 185,402 acres of grass and 7441 acres of hay and grain.

State Investigators Find Fraudulent Job Insurance Claims

As a result of rigid investigation of applications for unemployment insurance by agents of the Department of Unemployment during a three-month period, claimants have been ordered by courts to make restitution to the unemployment fund in the amount of \$2166 and also to pay fines of \$845, according to a report made by Edgar E. Lampton, vice-chairman of the California Unemployment Stabilization Commission. A total of 162 cases were turned over to investigators during the period stated.

RATIONING TIME TABLE

WAR RATION BOOK NO. 1
SHOES—Stamp 18 good for one pair. Expiration date indefinite.

WAR RATION BOOK 3
BROWN stamps—for meat, canned fish, most edible oils, cheeses and canned milk;
G, H, J, and K expire Dec. 4. L and M now valid, good till Jan. 1. N valid Dec. 5 till Jan. 1.
Stamp No. 1 on airplane sheet, 1 pair shoes, expiring date not set.

WAR RATION BOOK NO. 4
Stamp No. 29 (5 lbs. sugar)—Good now and through Jan. 15, 1944.
GREEN stamps—for canned, frozen and certain dehydrated foods; A, B and C good through Dec. 20. D, E and F valid Dec. 1 through Jan. 20, 1944.

GASOLINE
COUPON NO. 9 (A-book) good through Jan. 21 for three gallons of gasoline.
All new style coupons, A, B and C, must be endorsed on face with car license number and state of registration.

TIRE INSPECTION—C book holders—every 3 months, 4th inspection before Nov. 30. B book holders—every 4 months, 4th inspection before Feb. 29, 1944. A book holders—every 6 months, 3rd inspection before March 31.

RATION BOARD OFFICE HOURS—At 2300 Carson st., daily from 9:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

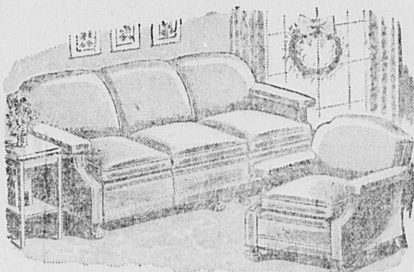
