

Assembly of God Dedicatory Rites Set for Next Sunday

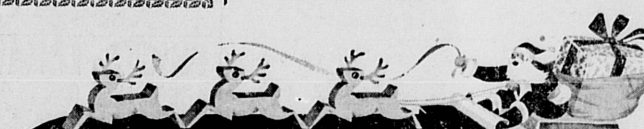
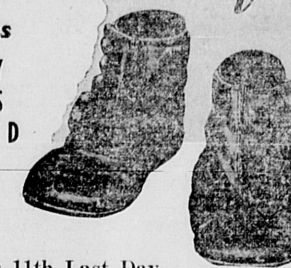
