### Chief McMaster **Cautions About Christmas Fires**

"I attend more Christmas parties than Santa Claus," J. E. McMaster, Torrance fire chief, said today. "But as long as people ignore fire hazards during the Christmas season, the department is bound to be kept on the run trying to cope with all the fires that break out. "Take the matter of Christmas trees. People used to decorate them with lighted candles; fortunately that dangerous practice has been almost discontinued in favor of electric lights. But electric lights themselves have certain dangers. Before installing lights on your tree, check the wiring to see that it is in good condition, and make sure that lamps fit securely in sockets so that no metallic parts are exposed.


