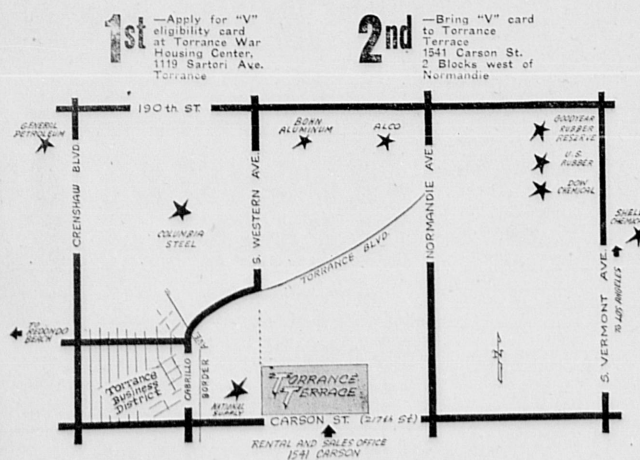

The board met earlier at Chicago but with the absence of Judge Pacht, confined to bed with influenza, and of Members Julian Alco and Dr. W. Earle Smith, it was found to be without a quorum. Later in the day Members Henry Craemer and George Briggs met with Judge Pacht at his Santa Monica home.

Plummer's resignation had been submitted earlier this month following an investigation of the prison conditions by a committee appointed by Gov. Warren.

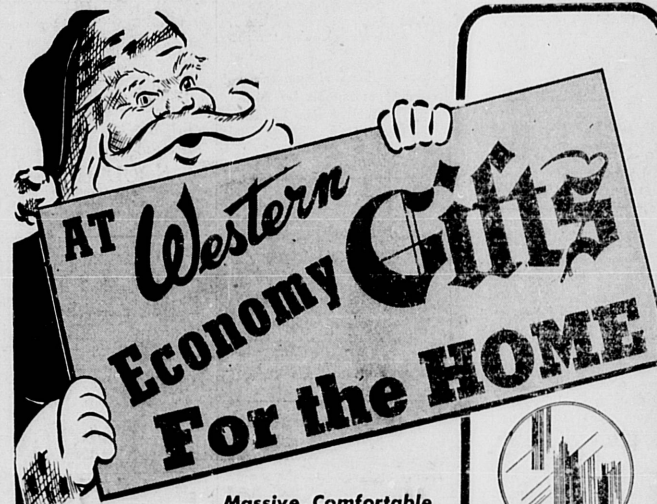

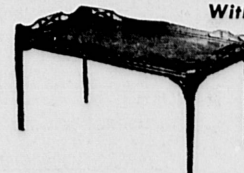
