Earl was a former popular student at the Torrance high school, Compton junior college and attended a college at Long Beach. Just before going into the Navy he was employed by the National Supply Co. in Torrance and sending a message to his former associates there to keep production going at full tilt so that the men on the fighting fronts can win the war and come home as soon as possible.

### Torrance Quota Set At \$650,000 for 4th War Bond Campaign

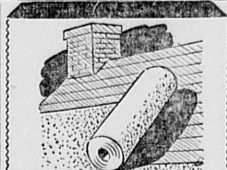
War Loan drive is 14 billion dollars, of which 5 1/2 billion dollars is to raised directly from individuals the latter amount being one-half billion dollars more than in the Third War Loan drive. Other non-bank investors will be called upon for the remaining \$8,500,000,000.

Securities to be offered will be: Series E, F and G bonds, Series C Savings Notes, 2 1/2 per cent and 2 1/4 per cent bonds, and 3 1/2 per cent certificates.

### Bank Restrictions

The Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco advises that certain restrictions have been placed upon bank purchases of government securities. Commercial banks may not, in general, purchase savings bonds; they may not hold the 2 1/2 per cent bonds until ten years after date of issue; they may not hold the 2 1/4 per cent bonds until Sept. 15, 1946; they are asked to purchase during the drive the 3 per cent certificates of indebtedness offered; and they are asked to refuse to make speculative loans for the purchase of government securities.

"This list of necessary restrictions, however, should not be allowed to obscure the fact that commercial banks have a positive and important part to play in the loan drives. A large volume of savings bond sales and all subscriptions for other government securities are made through the facilities of the banking system. Banks are, to the majority of their depositors, probably the most effective treasury salesmen. Permanent investment in government securities is facilitated by loans to individual subscribers who wish to anticipate future income, and banks are encouraged to make such loans on a short term basis, not exceeding six months," the Federal Reserve Bank says.
