A full discussion of the delinquency problem as it affects children in the Torrance, Lomita and Waltham area will be featured at the meeting of the Narbonne Coordinating Council in the Little Theater at Narbonne High School at 2 o'clock Friday, Jan. 28, it has been announced by Mrs. Kenneth Schwartz, president of the council.

The principal speaker will be Al Brehm, for the past three years head of all juvenile delinquency activity for the sheriff's office under the direction of Lt. E. W. Graeb. Brehm has studied psychiatry and psychology as it applies to juvenile delinquency problems and has had marked success in his work.

He will outline a legislative program that is being worked out in connection with the district attorney's office and will answer questions and talk in plain language to the parents he hopes will attend.

In addition to Brehm, Miss Inez Bloom of the Los Angeles Coordinating Council, who has visited here before, will speak, Mrs. Schwartz advises.
