Keep'em flying...with safety!

Good kite flyers heed the four safety rules below. They know that failure to observe these rules can result in injury to themselves and to power lines which carry electricity needed for war production. It's more fun to play safe when you fly your kites! Learn and follow these rules:

- 1. Fly kites in an open field, away from power lines and
- 2. Never use wire, tinsel or metallic string
- 3. Be sure the string is perfectly dry.
- 4. If the kite catches in a power line, let go immediately. Don't pull! Phone the company owning the line, and a lineman will come to get your kite for you.
