

RATIONING TIME TABLE

WAR RATION BOOK NO. 1
SHOES—Stamp 18 good for one pair. Expiration date indefinite.

WAR RATION BOOK 3
BROWN stamps—for meat, canned fish, most edible oils, cheeses and canned milk:
V, W and X now valid until Feb. 26.
Stamp No. 1 on airplane sheet (1 pair shoes), expiring date not set.
STAMP BONUS—Butchers will give two brown points for every pound of kitchen fats received.

WAR RATION BOOK NO. 4
Stamp No. 30 (5 lbs. sugar)—Good now and through March 31. Stamp No. 40 (5 lbs. sugar for canning)—Good Feb. 1 through Feb. 28.
GREEN stamps—for canned, frozen and certain dehydrated foods; G, H, J, valid to Feb. 20. K, L, M, valid now; good until March 20.
RED stamps (10 points) for meat, canned fish, most edible oils, cheeses, canned milk:
AS, Feb. 27; BS, Feb. 27; CS, valid Feb. 27; DS, ES and FS, March 12, expire May 20.
BLUE stamps (10 points each) for canned, frozen and certain dehydrated foods:
AS, BS, CS, DS and ES, valid Feb. 27, expire May 20.

GASOLINE—
No. 10 coupon good for three gallons of gasoline till March 21 inclusive.
All coupons, A, B and C, must be endorsed on face with car license number and state of registration.

TIRE INSPECTION—C book holders—every 3 months, 5th inspection before Feb. 29, B book holders—every 4 months, 4th inspection before Feb. 29. A book holders—every 6 months, 3rd inspection before March 31. T coupons every 6 months or 5000 miles of driving.

RATION BOARD OFFICE HOURS—At 2300 Carson st., daily from 9:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Lobar Pneumonia Cases Follow Flu, Health Dept. Says

Although reported influenza cases showed a drop during the past week, county health officials today expressed concern over the increase in reported cases of lobar pneumonia. This suggests that complications and relapses following influenza attacks are becoming more prevalent. As a precaution, convalescing "flu" patients should get sufficient rest and make a gradual return to normal activity, stressed Dr. R. O. Gilbert, assistant county health officer.

A decided increase in measles, mumps and scarlet fever is indicated by the communicable disease record for the past week. Scarlet fever rose from 64 cases for the previous week to 120 last week, while 250 cases of mumps and 93 cases of measles were reported last week.

TIRES FOR TRUCKS

Torrance operators of commercial vehicles may now receive aid in obtaining scarce tires. The plan calls for each commercial operator who is eligible for tires, but unable to obtain tire certificates from the local war price and rationing boards to report the fact at once to the nearest district office division of motor transport, Office of Defense Transportation, for appropriate action.

Census Takers Begin Wartime Count In Area

Representatives of the Bureau of Census have arrived in southern California for the purpose of making a wartime census in Los Angeles and Orange counties. When it is completed figures on the up-to-the-minute population of Torrance, as well as other industrial centers is expected to be available.

It is expected to take about two months to complete the task. The census is being taken at the request of the Committee on Congested Areas, it was stated.

The prime objective of the canvass is to determine the number, sex, age, employment status and family characteristics of the population of the area. Another purpose of the undertaking is to aid in determining needs of the area for increased allotments of food, clothing and other necessities, which are based upon latest population statistics, it was emphasized.

Social Agencies Object to Slicing Operation Funds

Crippling of vital health and welfare programs will ensue in the Los Angeles area if Latham Act funds are not provided as originally planned, it was set forth in a protest sent last week by the Council of Social Agencies to government leaders in Washington.

According to the protest, among services which must be retained are 150 child care centers in the county, providing for 5000 children of mothers working in war industries; provision for 400 greatly needed additional hospital beds, a Negro health center, and a supplemental program to combat venereal disease. These are said to be imperiled by the proposal to cut from a federal general deficiency bill some \$50,000,000 intended for the Latham Act program.

Olin Wellborn, III, president of the council, in the protest to Washington said: "We will need an expansion of the program rather than curtailment."

The Council of Social Agencies represents 143 public health and welfare departments, Community Chest and other agencies.

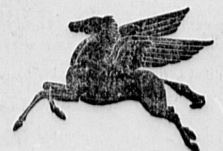
