Early January Clear Weather Beneficial to Vegetable Crops

Clear and warm days ince spread activity on farms in Los Angeles County, Harold J. Ryan, agricultural commissioner, stated in a report on crop conditions. Fruit trees were pruned, immense acreages of land were prepared and planted to grain or alfalfa. Vegetable growers got ready to plant, and in many instances planted spring crops.

Remembering the poor prices received for vegetables during the past summer, many farmers are aiming for spring maturing the past summer, many farmers are aiming for spring maturing crops and according to their stated intentions, plan on lighter production in mid-summer. Pre-liminary estimates, gained from a survey now in progress of all commercial vegetable farms, indicate that early plantings exceed those of a year ago.

Maturity Hastened
Unseasonably warm weather in the fore part of the month hastened maturity of winter vegetables such as cauliflower, cabbage and brococil, and brought heavy supplies on the market. Ryan said. Cabbage supplies will increase in February and the amount of local celery for market will decrease. Brocoli harvest has passed its peak and some growers quit harvesting because of low wholesale prices. Nearly all of the snowball cauliflower was harvested by the end of the month.

Dry Spanish onions will continue to be extremely scarce until the new crop is ready in April or May. Onion plantings in this county show a decided increase, according to Ryan.

Practically All Beef, Veal, Multon Point Values Change

Most cuts of beef, lamb and veal show an increase of from one to two ration points this week, with cheeses and lard also costing additional brown points and canned rish about 25 percent lower. Major changes in the February list as summed up by Batthis were as follows:

Beef steak cuts up 2 points; most other cuts of beef up 1 point.

Veal, lamb and mutton up 1 to 2 points, with pork loin cuts 1 point higher.

All cheeses are 2 to 4 points higher, lard is up 1 point and butter is left unchanged at 16 points.
