

Rev. Roloff Leaving To Attend Church Conference In East

Supervisors Oppose Colorado River Water Treaty With Mexico

A protest against a pending treaty between the United States and Mexico which would guarantee the latter government 1,500,000 acre-feet of water each year from the Colorado river was adopted by the Board of Supervisors last Tuesday at the request of the Metropolitan Water District officials, according to Supervisor Hauge.

The board was informed by representatives of the district that in years of low water runoff this guarantee would deprive the district and other American users of Colorado river water a sufficient supply, and that Mexico's interests should be secondary to those of the United States.

The Metropolitan Water District representatives also informed the board that in the event this treaty is adopted it may retard the growth of this area from four to five million people.

Fred H. Bixby, member of a pioneer Los Angeles County family, has accepted the invitation of County Supervisor Oscar Hauge to be one of the principal speakers at the county's 94th birthday "party" in Los Angeles on Friday, Feb. 25.

The observance will be held on the site of the old court house at 2 p. m. At one time the Bixby family owned the vast land interests of the Los Alamitos and Los Cerritos ranches, most of which have been cut up into subdivisions.

Supervisor Hauge said that during the entire week of Feb. 18 service clubs and historical groups throughout the county will be asked to devote their programs toward a better understanding of the historical background of the county.

The county was formed on Feb. 15, 1850, and many of the early day official records at the Hall of Records are written in the Spanish language. Isadore B. Dockweiler, pioneer Los Angeles resident, will preside at the ceremonies, according to Supervisor Hauge.
