Between Dec. 1, 1941, and Nov. 30, 1943, 776,000 soldiers were honorably discharged from the Army, the War Department has announced.

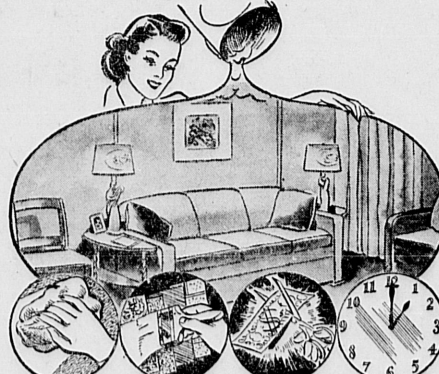
