U. S. Steel's 222,602 stockholders would fill the Rose Bowl 25 times For this army of owners, U. S. Steel earned in 1943 the smallest return on investment (3.97%) in any year of large production. Rising costs in 1943, pushing against price ceilings, resulted in lower net earning and therefore in lower taxes. There were \$8 million less for future needs than in 1942 (\$53 million less than in 1941), despite a substantial increase in receipts in 1943.
