Feeder Airline Hearings Set

Secretary Harry B. Lewis of the Chamber of Commerce today announced he had been advised by Southwest Airways that hearings on the airline's proposals to establish feeder lines, one of which would include Torrance, will begin in Washington April 27. Formal hearings are expected to follow within 60 days.

Lewis has been suggested as a representative of this city at the Civil Aeronautics board's hearings. At the request of Southwest Airways and federal officials he is preparing official figures on population, amount of mail handled monthly here and what proportion of it would use local air mail service, bank clearings and deposits, carloadings and kindred information.

Lewis, pointing out the value to the city and surrounding area of direct air connection with transcontinental air lines, said that after the war the Lomita Air Strip probably will be available for commercial use.
