Activities. These are the Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, Camp Fire Girls, Woodcraft Rangers, Young Men's and Young Women's Christian Associations. A committee room also is available for meetings of these groups.

**Secretary on Duty**

A full-time secretary will direct the center, representatives from various agencies devoting such time there as conditions warrant. Referrals will be made by the secretary to Community Chest agencies of institutional character such as Children's Hospital, Orthopaedic Hospital, Volunteers of America Home for Children, Los Angeles Orphanage, Vista del Mar, McKinley Home for Boys; clinics, both medical and psychiatric for both children and adults; youth training homes such as the Home of the Good Shepherd, California Junior Republic, Pacific Lodge for Boys, etc.

The center has been made available by special allocation of Community Chest funds, included in contributions to the Los Angeles Area War Chest.

The local advisory committee will have the special function of bringing needs and conditions in Torrance to executives at Community Chest general headquarters, and to counsel and advise the center secretary.

Shortage of sugar, which is necessitating the closing of Alma's Pastry Shop, 1925 Carson st., several days a week, is receiving the attention of U. S. Senator Sheridan Downey, it was learned today.

In an effort to keep the bakery operating on a continuous daily schedule for the convenience of war plant workers and other customers, Senator Downey is reported to be contacting the regional director of the OPA at San Francisco.

A representative of Senator Downey stated that Frank Daniels, chief clerk of the Torrance War Ration board, was also giving the matter his full cooperation and has offered to assist the bakery shop owner, Mrs. Alma Schulz, in the preparation of claims to support her request for increased sugar allotments.

**County Swim Pool Rates Announced**

A schedule of rates to be charged for admission to swimming pools under county jurisdiction was adopted by the Board of Supervisors Tuesday, according to Supervisor Oscar Hauge.

The charge will be 5 cents for children under 12 years, 15 cents including tax for those from 12 to 16 years, and 20 cents for those above 16 years, with servicemen and women admitted free.

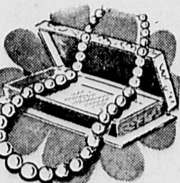
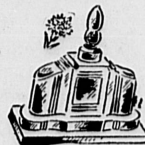
