Mr. Bordeaux is survived by three sons, Colonel LeRay Bordeaux of New York City, Dr. Jean Bordeaux of Los Angeles, Bernard Oliver Bordeaux, rancher of Riddle, Oregon, and three grandchildren, Jean, Jr., in the U. S. Navy, Suzanne and Bruce, students at Riddle, Oregon.
