K. E. Bradley, manager of the local office, states that representatives of all war plants, the municipal bus lines, the Chamber of Commerce, the Office of Price Administration and other related agencies will meet with the United States Employment Service to discuss ways to improve conditions by better use of share-the-ride arrangements. While certain agencies have been invited, all who are interested in the problem should attend, according to Bradley.

Need Noted Bradley pointed out that throughout the county there is an immediate, critical need for 30,266 additional workers, including 21,066 required by high gency war factories, 5000 peded for vital military operations of growing importance and other vital construction workers now needed on housing jobs and other vital construction profests. The committee said it wished to emphasize that, in connection with preparation of this report, it studied and found groundless reports from some smaller war plant owners that a surplus of labor exists in the area.

During the past month there has been an alarming exodus of workers from the ship building and repair industry in face of schedule calling for increased output of combat troop transports and cargo vessels and a stepping up of ship repair activity.

Urgent need has developed for rubber industry workers to meet increased schedules for heavy duty tires and tubes for trucks of planes; new machines, just into production, must be manned.

Most of the cases coming to the attention of the Torrance Service Center during the past week have been child care cases for working mothers, many with husbands in the armed service.

Cases Referred
