Torrance Girls' softball team, which earned a tie for the first round championship of the Long Beach Recreation league, reached a new high for the season last week when Myrtle Schubert hurled four-hit ball to lead the local outfit to a 4-to-1 nod over the high-powered Western Pipe and Steel outfit.
