

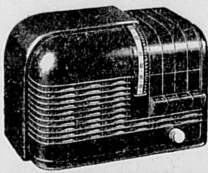

BODY TYPE—Transit type design, door ahead of front axle. No baggage compartment. Specify overall body width, length and height. Hand rail overhead.

BODY INTERIOR—Genuine leather urban type seats, spring cushions. Eleven rows of seats all facing front. Adequate ventilation.

ENGINE—In rear or under floor. Minimum 140 horsepower. Gasoline. Specify make, bore, stroke, displacement, torque, etc.
