In it are catifish, bluegill, bass and carp. Strangely, the surface of the water is comparatively clean and not covered with oil as are great sections of the harbor. City Councilman George H. Moore of Wilmington says the creation of a park about the slough is in the council's master plan for the early post-war period.
