A practice drill is held every other Sunday morning and is carried out like that of a regular run with each boy performing a special duty.

Their fire station is located in a garage next to Page's service station, Carson and Harvard, and is shared by the Auxiliary Firemen and Los Angeles in Air Raid Wardens of Zone 14.
