Plane Crashes Tent but Local Sailor Lives

Wounded when a plane crashed into a tent in which he was lying, William E. Buckley, SK-2'c, U. S. Navy, of Torrance, is alive to tell the tale, and in a letter to his wife he said "it's the nearest I ever came to saying 'so long' to this old world, and I don't want it to happen again."

The sailor, who has had four ships shot out from under him at sea, and who once was in the water for 18 hours before rescue, was on his stomach and received a bad, deep cut and fractured pelvis when the plane crashed into the tent. All his belongings were torn or mangled beyond use. One of his buddles was wounded and another killed in the freak accident. "If I had been on my back, it would have been just too bad," Buckley said.

The accident, which happened in late July, put the sailor in a hospital at one of the Pacific navy bases.
