

So. California Schools Lead War Plane Financing

Southern California public, private and parochial school students led the nation in number of war planes financed by the purchase of War Stamps and Bonds during the 'Buy-a-Plane' campaign last semester.

The "Schools-at-War" education section, U. S. Treasury, has notified local school administrators that of the 2,642 planes, valued at \$87,970,000 financed by the school students of America through the recent campaign, 472 or 18% of the total were paid for by the children in the 11 Southern California counties.

Thomas S. Reece Is Lineman In Italian Unit

Constructing telephone lines as far forward as enemy fire permits is the assignment of Pfc. Thomas S. Reece, whose home is in the Plaza Hotel, Torrance, with a wire construction company of the 68th Signal Battalion serving in Italy. He is a lineman.

His company installs all telephone and teletype facilities within the Fifth Army command unit and between subordinate units in the field.

Trained mine-sweepers work with the company, as much of its work is done under fire, or soon after the enemy has withdrawn. At Cassino, the company had wire lines laid to the outskirts of the town weeks before its fall. Keeping military communications flowing freely is of vital importance and every time the command post or subordinate corps change headquarters locations, the wire construction crews move out several days in advance, laying their wires, erecting poles and sweeping mines from their path. Duplicate equipment is available so that the new network of wires is ready for use before the system at the old site is removed.

Besides the construction companies, the battalion consists of a wire operations company that operates and maintains wire communications, and a headquarters company that operates, maintains and services radio installations and operates the army message center and code room.

For exceptionally meritorious performance of duty, the battalion recently was awarded the Fifth Army Plaque by Lt. Gen. Mark W. Clark, Fifth Army Commander. The battalion came over to the first convoy of United States troops in January, 1942, and served in Ireland, England and North Africa before coming to Italy.

Fulfilling a last-minute request to provide a rare, old-fashioned Christmas for the American boys who will comprise the Mercy's passenger list at yuletide, the Red Cross camp and hospital corps, Junior Red Cross, production and purchasing departments combined their efforts to meet the departure deadline.
