**Processed Foods To Go Off Ration List**

Virtually all processed foods other than canned fruits will be returned to prewar nonrationed status in ten days, the White House announced, and a War Food Administration spokesman indicated that additional meat also may be made ration-free soon.

War Mobilization Director J. F. Byrnes directed the removal from rationing on Sept. 17 of these items:

All jams, jellies, fruit butters, asparagus, lima beans, corn, peas, pumpkin and squash, mixed vegetables, baked beans, tomato sauce, paste and puree, and all varieties of soups and baby foods.
