He flew on a 1,600-mile round trip to the Polish Corridor with an Eighth Fighter Command P-51 Mustang group. In setting the new mark, the Mustang group, commanded by Col. George T. Crowell of Chicago, Ill., escorted heavy bombers while the big planes blasted aiperaft factories in Poland. Although the thrust was the fighter group's deepest pehetration of German-held territory, it was not the first time the outfit has guarded bombers far from base. The group began protecting bombers from Nazi fighter attacks almost a year ago. Since then the fighter unit has shepherded the big planes over such targets as Kiel, Bremen, Ludwigshaven, Augsburg and Frederickshaven.
