Lt. W. H. Allen On Record Long Distance Flight

First Lieutenant William H. Allen, son of Chief Yeoman and Mrs. D. C. Hilliard, 21922 S. Main st., Torrance, recently helped set a new long-distance record for British-based fighter planes. He flew on a 1,600-mile round trip to the Polish Corridor with an Eighth Fighter Command P-51 Mustang group.

In setting the new mark, the Mustang group, commanded by Col. George T. Crowell of Chicago, Ill., escorted heavy bombers while the big planes blasted aircraft factories in Poland. Although the thrust was the fighter group's deepest penetration of German-held territory, it was not the first time the outfit has guarded bombers far from base. The group began protecting bombers from Nazi fighter attacks almost a year ago. Since then the fighter unit has shepherded the big planes over such targets as Kiel, Bremen, Ludwigshafen, Augsburg and Friedrickshaven.

Before and after invasion day the group has been dive-bombing and strafing in addition to continuing bomber escort work. His wife, Patricia A. Allen, resides at 204 1/2 Ximeno ave., Long Beach. The 20-year-old flyer was employed with the Coca Cola Company before en-

Red Cross Is Ready to Aid In Disaster

The role the American Red Cross is prepared to play in case of disaster in this area was reaffirmed this week with the directing of more than 1,200 letters from the disaster preparedness and relief committee to industrial and war plants, railroad and airline managements and regional Army and Navy leaders.

Pointing out that the Red Cross welfare resources available in time of emergency, include the four primary services of food, shelter, clothing and registration and information, Gurney E. Newlin, chairman of the Los Angeles Chapter, declared:

"The occurrence of the Port Chicago explosion and the threatened hazard experience in the recent Girard area forest fire here has made it advisable to set forth the services Red Cross is prepared to perform in this area."

"In addition to the primary services listed, Red Cross further is prepared to give medical assistance to the extent of furnishing nurses and nurse's aides," Newlin said. Such medical aid, he explained in his letter, is "supplementary to that given by local medical and health authorities."
