## **Post-War Wonders are Described** To Rotarians by E. F. Flynn

"Many people believe that be cause geographical fron tiers have vanished that all opportunity may vanished that all opportunity agone with these fron tiers," said Edward F. Flynn director of public relations of the Great Northern Railway Co. St. Paul, in an address on "Shores of Opportunity," delivered to the Torrance Rotary of the Spet. 14. Flynn continued, "There is, however, a new fronter for every generation. Present frontiers are largely me chanical and technological Many believe that we are reaching the end of the automotive frontier which began some forty years ago, but a great automotive research engineer (Charles P. Kettering of General Motors) recently said that we are coming into a new automotive frontier because we do not know anything about engineering yet. Undoubtedly this new automotive frontier will open up as soon, as the war is over. We are likely to have a new lighter and less expensive automobilo operating with 150 octane gaso. In which will give us perhaps 50 miles to the gailon."
