## RATION FACTS

MEATS, CHEESES, CANNED MILK, CANNED FISH—Book 4 red stamps, 10 points, A8 through Z8 and A5 through G5 valid indefinitely.

PROCESSED FOODS—Book 4 blue stamps, 10 points, A8 through Z8 and A5 through L5. NOTE—New red and blue stamps will become valid on or about the first of each month. Blue one-point tokens expire Oct. 1.

SUGAR—Book 4 stamps 30, 31, 32 and 33 valid indefinitely for five pounds each, stamp 40 good for five pounds for home canning through Feb. 28, 1945.

Obtain application for addition canning sugar at local OPA boards. Application, when filled out, must be accompanied by spare stamp 37. Applicants may request up to 20 pounds per ration book. Second period applications may be filed to Oct. 20.

Ask your local OPA board for your consumer meat and grocery price lists.

SHOES—Book 3 airplane stamps 1 and 2 good indefinitely. NOTE: Take book along to make purchase.

GASOLINE—A13 coupons good for four gallons to Dec. 21. B2, B3, C2 and C3 coupons good for five gallons.

All coupons must be endorsed on face with car license number and state of registration. PRICES—For all information regarding prices contact the Price Clerk of your local board.

## TINY BUT FAST

Gyroscopes, those fascinating and all-important contrivances which keep guns steady, help steer torpedoes, and whatnot, need electric motors to keep them spinning, and Westinghouse engineers have had to meet extremely exacting demands in designing them. One motor must bring its gyro-flywheel to a full speed of 12,000 revolutions per minute in two-tenths of a second. Another has a flywheel balanced so perfectly that "short weight" of as much as 1/10,000th of an ounce affects its operation.

## IMPROVE THE FLAVOR

To improve the flavor of frozen vegetables and also retain their nutritive content, this is how they're cooked at the Westinghouse Home Economics Institute: Heat two tablespoons of fat in saucepan. Break the still-frozen vegetables into medium-sized pieces and drop them into the fat. (Don't add water unless heat cannot be evenly controlled.) Cover and cook over high heat until a full steam is reached, then reduce heat to a simmer and cook until just tender. Takes about ten minutes.

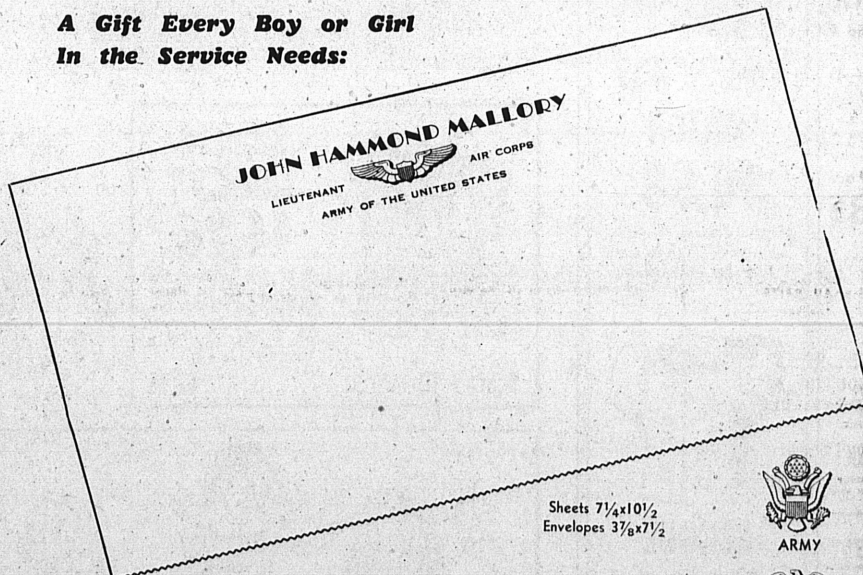
## SOMETHING FISHY

If dishwashing is especially discouraging after something fishy, this trick practiced by Westinghouse home economists will cheer you up: Fill cooking utensil with clear water, add a tablespoon or so of vinegar and bring water to a boil for a minute or two. The trick not only banishes the fishy odor, but also loosens food stuck to the pan. Rinse serving dishes in hot vinegar water also before washing them.

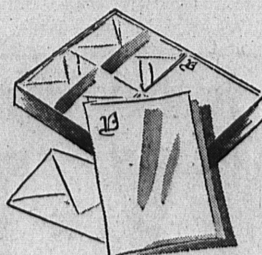
