> New Red and **Blue Stamps** Valid Oct. 1

Three more red ration stamps, totaling 30 points for meats and fats, and five more blue stamps amounting to 50 points for pro-cessed foods, became valid Sun-

cessed foods, became valid Sunday, Oct. 1.

The Office of Price Administration said:

Blue stamps to be validated are M5, N5, P5, Q5 and R5.

Red stamps to be validated are H5, J5 and K5.

All stamps will be good indefinitely. OPA said it is not expected that any more red stamps will be validated until Oct. 29 and blue stamps until Nov. 1.


