

Quandt Pumping Deal May be Post-War Project

A postwar employment plan is part of a proposal for Torrance to purchase the Quandt pumping station and water system which serves the Walteria area.

Offered to the city at approximately \$50,000, the system is considered by many Walteria residents as being a good investment for the future of the community, according to George Thatcher, member of the Civic Organization.

The system, Thatcher pointed out, will have to grow to meet the demands of a growing community and by the time the war is ended it would be the basis of an improved system.

The water system, the improvement of the five-acre park area recently purchased, construction of a meeting hall and other facilities is a substantial work backlog for the community.

Quandt has offered to sell the water system to the city for \$42,500. Its franchise has 20

Pacific Electric Route Change Is Being Opposed

City officials of Palos Verdes Estates, Redondo Beach, Hermosa Beach and Manhattan Beach opposed El Segundo claims in a State Railroad Commission hearing in Los Angeles Tuesday over the routing of the Pacific Electric Railway Co.'s Playa Del Rey bus line between Torrance's Hollywood Riviera section and Los Angeles.

The service, as originally established, skirted the ocean front on Mar Vista blvd., ran through the Playa Del Rey hills and had an alternate line serving the El Segundo business district.

As a wartime measure, Playa Del Rey line buses have been routed through El Segundo since 1942, providing that community with service on both bus lines, but adding approximately 20 minutes to the running time of the Playa Del Rey schedule. Beach cities will ask permanent routing of the bus line through the Mar Vista area, a measure that is opposed by El Segundo.
