The Carlsbad Army Air Field is the newest bombardier school in the Army Air Forces Training Command.

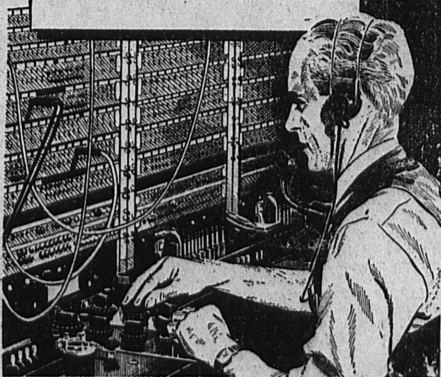
