

Eckersley Ends Navy Training At Great Lakes

Bluejacket Ivan L. Eckersley, 32, 1020 Anapola ave., Torrance, Calif., received recognition as eligible to qualify for the petty officer rate of motor machinist's mate third class during recent graduation ceremonies at the Naval Training School (Diesel) on the Iowa State College campus, Ames, Iowa.

Selection to attend the specialty school is based on the results of recruit training aptitude test scores. The course of study includes the use, operation and maintenance of diesel engines. A theoretical phase is concerned with diesel engine theory, electrical fundamentals and machine shop operation.

The graduate is now awaiting further duty orders to sea or to some shore station.

DUCK HUNTING OPENS IN SOUTH WITH WILD BIRDS PLENTIFUL

Saturday morning one-half hour before sunrise, Oct. 14, marked the opening of the season on ducks, geese and mudhens in California, with the exception of San Bernardino, Riverside and Imperial counties. In these three counties the season does not open until Nov. 2.

All hunters must have a state hunting license to shoot waterfowl and those over the age of 16 years must have a federal duck stamp. The use of live decoys and feeding is prohibited. It is illegal to use shotguns larger than 10 gauge, rifles, repeaters and automatics carrying more than three shells and sink boxes.

Bag limits are: Ducks—Daily limit, 10 in aggregate, all species (1 may be a wood duck) and 5 sprig, wide-gauge or mallard singly or in aggregate. Two daily limits may be in possession, except on opening day.

Geese—Daily limit, Lesser Snow and White Fronted (Specks) 4 in aggregate and 2 other geese (Honkers, Hutchins, Cacklers, etc.). Possession limit, 2 daily limits (except on opening day).

Mudhens—Daily and possession limit 25.

American and Red Mergansers—Daily and possession limit 25. Following is a report by county on present conditions:

Los Angeles County—Fair number of ducks have been coming in on the various bodies of water in the Antelope Valley area. Numerous sprig noted at Bolsa Chica.

Orange County—A good number of ducks on lakes and clubs—mostly sprig, with teal second.

San Diego County—Ducks arriving in goodly numbers. City
