In the Revolutionary War, Marines fought with George Washington at Trenton and Princeton. Not all Marine activity last year was in the Pacific. They managed to get into the European scrap, too, by serving as gun crews on secondary batteries aboard ships in both French invasions. Another unit of 90 men occupied three strategic islands off Marseilles and rounded up some 900 Nazi prisoners.
