RATION FACTS

MEATS, CHEESES, CANNED MILK, BUTTER, CANNED FISH—Book 4 red stamps, 10 points, A8 through 28 and A5 through P6, valid indefinitely.

PROCESSED FOODS—Book 4 blue stamps, 10 points, A8 through 28 and A5 through W5, valid indefinitely.

NOTE—New red and blue stamps will become valid on or about the first of each month.

SUGAR—Book 4 stamps 30, 31, 32 and 33 valid indefinitely for five pounds each, stamp 40 good for five pounds for home canning through Feb. 28, 1945.

Obtain application for addition canning sugar at local OPA boards. Application, when filled out, must be accompanied by spare stamp 37. Applicants may request up to 20 pounds per ration book. Second period applications may be filed to Oct. 20.

SHOES—Book 3 airplane stamps 1, 2 and 3 good indefinitely. NOTE: Take book along to make purchase.

GASOLINE—A13 coupons good for four gallons to Dec. 21. B3 and C3 coupons good for five gallons.

All coupons must be endorsed on face with car license number and state of registration.
