## GI Home Loans by Private Lending Institutions Is Expedited by FHA

The Federal Housing Administration acted today to expedite the making of insured home loans to veterans by private lending institutions under the terms of the G.I. Bill of Rights.

Announcement was made by John E. McGovern, director, Southern California district, FHA, that his office is now accepting from private lending institutions applications for the insurance of principal loans supplemented by loans under Section 505 of the G.I. Bill.

These are cases where the Veterans' Administration guarantees an equity loan not to exceed \$2,000, and where the principal loan, which must comply with FHA regulations, is insured by the FHA.

"Instructions regarding the acceptance and processing of applications for the FHA insured loans have been received from our Washington headquarters," McGovern said. "The usual FHA procedure will be followed in handling the applications. Notification has been sent to all private financial institutions in Southern California, approved to make FHA insured loans, of the changes made necessary in FHA regulations to comply with the provisions of the G.I. Bill."

Equity loans, not to exceed 20 per cent of the reasonable normal value of the property up to \$2,000, may be guaranteed by the Veterans' Administration and are junior to the FHA insured loan, which may be repaid in monthly installments covering principal, interest, taxes and hazard insurance, and the one-half per cent insurance premium, over a period up to 25 years.
