For taking over the limit of pheasants one day before the opening of the season, William Sweeney, city judge of Daly City, was fined \$300 by Judge W. L. Callender of Willows. The case was tried Nov. 30, after Judge Sidner of Orland disqualfied himself and requested Judge Callender to act in his olace.

The arrest was made by Fish and Game Wardens Rilford Tutt, Floyd Loots, E. J. Johnson and Earl Vall, who apprehended Sweeney with six wild pheasants in his possession.

H. E. Moore, Vallejo shipyard worker, was arrested Nov. 26 by Wardens Vall, Sawyer, Tutt and Loots for having three untagged pheasants over the daily limit in his possession. Moore was taken before Judge Flint P. Sidner, of Orland, and fined \$125.
