Few Receive Medal of Honor From Government

The nation's highest military award—the Medal of Honor—has been awarded by the War Department to only 68 officers and enlisted men for valor in the present war, it was announced today at Fort Douglas, Utah, headquarters of the Ninth Service Command.

The award, popularly known as the "Congressional Medal", is made in the name of Congress. It is given to military personnel for "conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity at the risk of life—a deed which left undone would not subject the man to criticism.

Recommendations for the award must be approved by the War Department or an officer in the rank of brigadier general or higher. In addition, an eyewitness report must accompany the recommendation.

SEABEES PLAN OBSERVATION OF THIRD ANNIVERSARY, TORRANCE MEMBERS SAY

Two Torrance men in the Seabees, serving overseas, have sent the Torrance Herald an item of commemoration of the birthday of the U. S. Naval Construction Battalions on Dec. 28, 1941.

The men are John W. Parker, MM2/c, 35th Naval Construction Battalion, FPO, San Francisco, and L. W. Pascoe, EM1/c, 116th Naval Construction Battalion, FPO, San Francisco.

The item reads: "The third anniversary of the workingest, fightingest bunch of men in the nation's armed forces, the Navy Seabees, will be observed on Dec. 28, by 240,000 officers and men of the United States Naval Construction Battalions.

"Born just three weeks after the Pearl Harbor district, with an authorized strength of 3,000, the Seabees won their spurs at Guadalcanal and have been with the assault troops in every major American amphibious operation. They can now boast that they built the network of air

and naval bases in the Pacific that pushed the Japs back 8,000 miles; that they developed amphibious equipment and techniques that helped carry the day on the African, Sicilian, Italian and Normandy beachheads.

"Every commissioned construction battalion is either currently overseas or has completed a tour of duty; many battalions are on their second tours. Seventy-six percent of the Seabees are now outside continental limits of the United States; only 9,000 essential men have never seen foreign service.

"As General Douglas MacArthur wrote in a letter to Seabee chief, Vice Admiral Ben Morell, 'The only trouble with your Seabees is that you don't have enough of them.'"

Mihalow's Group Gets Second Citation

Cpl. Joseph M. Mihalow, son of Mrs. Sylvia Mihalow, 265 E. 62nd st., Los Angeles, is serving as a communications clerk with a heavy bombardment group, which recently was awarded a second War Department citation for outstanding performance in the Mediterranean theatre of operations.

He is now authorized to wear an Oak Leaf Cluster on his Distinguished Unit Badge. This second citation was for a daring and successful attack on the Concordia Vega oil refinery at Ploesti, Rumania. The first was for an attack on the rail yards at Bucharest, Rumania, during which 40 enemy aircraft were destroyed.

At Ploesti, despite an unusually heavy smoke screen which had caused other units of the attacking force to seek alternative targets, his group stayed on its course and dropped its bombs on the refinery with exceptional, devastating accuracy. Three bombers of the group were lost to the heavy anti-aircraft fire of the enemy.

The twice-cited unit is commanded by Lt. Col. Jack L. Randolph of Fort Worth, Tex. It has made more than 175 attacks against widespread targets in the crumbling Nazi empire.
