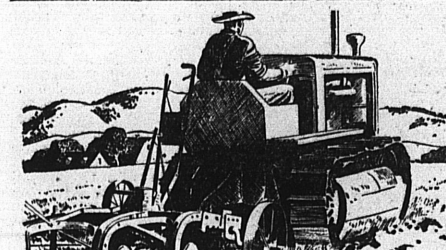

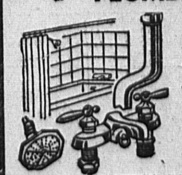

#### State Guard Driver Classes Are Concluded

For the purpose of suggesting to California State Guard officers ways to evaluate and train their drivers, a three-day accident prevention institute has just been concluded under the direction of Col. Allen Kimberly,

southern security district commander.

Meeting at Exposition park in Los Angeles, State Guard representatives from neighboring counties heard automobile maintenance and safety lectures given by the Automobile Club of Southern California.

Used in the course was Automobile Club equipment which simulates actual driving conditions and measures brake reaction time, hand steadiness, distance judgment, and width and

acuteness of vision.

Behind-the-wheel instruction was given by club representatives. Training in smooth driving and stops, backing, parking, and maneuvering vehicles in limited spaces was conducted in a street roped off and converted into a driving skill test course.
